

Foreword

The government of The Gambia has accorded employment important status in its development frameworks. Its long-term development objective, Vision 2020, gave due recognition to the need for seek to a well-educated, trained, skilled, healthy, self-reliant and enterprising population to facilitate the transformation of The Gambia into a financial centre, a tourist paradise, a trading, export-oriented, agricultural and manufacturing nation, thriving on free market policies and a vibrant private sector; thereby guaranteeing a well-balanced eco-system and a decent standard of living for one and all, under a system of government based on the consent of the citizenry."

The principal objectives of the country's medium-term development agenda (Program for Accelerated Growth and Employment (PAGE) also articulates the need to improve human resource potential of the country by, improving Employment levels; Per Capita Income; Human Development; Gender Equity. It is hoped that progress in these issues would also improve the Country's Competitiveness and development prospects.

With employment identified as driving force in the country's agenda, labour market related data is vital in tracking, assessing and planning employment related issues. This forms the basis for the commissioning of this study.

The Gambia's first Labour Force Survey was conducted in 1992. This was a localized study covering areas just around the capital Banjul. Other related issues were also covered as modules in some surveys and the country's Population and Housing Censuses. The Gambia Labour Force Survey 2012 (GLFS 2012), is the first nationally representative Labour Force Survey. This is a relative more comprehensive in coverage and also follows ILO guidelines.

It is hoped that findings of The Gambia's 2012 Labour Force Survey would provide Government and stakeholders with labour market information on employment, unemployment and other related indicators for informed policy formulation and decision in employment promotion and socio-economic development in general.

The Bureau wish to thank Mrs. Salimatta Touray of GAMJOBS and Mr. Momodou Lamin Cessay and Mr. Lamin Dampha of MOTIE for their cooperation and support. CHAPTER 1: BACKGROUND

1.1 Introduction

Employment is an imminent issue for the Government of the Gambia. It is a key pillar in the country's medium and long-term development agenda- notably the Programme for Accelerated Growth and Development (PAGE) and Vision 2020 respectively.

Although often misconstrued as a solution to some our socio-economic challenges, employment could be viewed as a means to achieving, full productive employment, decent work and sustainable livelihoods if properly constituted. The Gambia is not well endowed with material natural resources. In order to effectively optimise our economic productivity, there is need to efficiently harness our human resources to make-up for a deficit in the other factors of production.

Having recognize that decent and productive work for all is key to addressing poverty and hunger MDG 1, the United Nations in 2007, setup the Inter-Agency and Expert Group (IAEG) on Millennium Development Goal (MDG) Indicators to deliberate on the expansion on Millennium Development Goals (MDGs). Agreement was reach in 2008 to modify MG1 to include a new target called MDG1B. MDG1B is about achieving full and productive employment and decent work for all, including women and young people / youths.

The inclusion of employment indicators in the MDGs is in part to bring to the fore the human resource potential of countries as well as to enhance the visibility and use of employment indicators in national and international labour market information, and poverty monitoring systems. As employment inputs, outputs and outcomes are crosscutting, It is hope that use of these indicators would improve policy formulation in the employment and other sectors.

The following are the four core employment indicators to be use to assess MDG 1B:

- 1.4 Growth rate of labour productivity (GDP per person employed)
- 1.5 Employment-to-population ratio
- 1.6 Proportion of employed people living below the poverty line (working poor)
- 1.7 Proportion of own-account and contributing family workers in total employment (vulnerable employment rate)

However, there is an additional employment-related indicator falls under MDG Goal 3, Promote gender equality and empower women. This is:

3.2 Share of women in wage employment in the non-agricultural sector

1.2 Background

Gambia Bureau of Statistics in association with GAMJOBS and the Ministry of Trade, Regional Integration and Employment is conducting the 2012 Labour Force Survey. This survey would

conducted annually in resource are available, and possibly quarterly in the future. This would facilitate comparisons of data and assessment of trends over time.

Continuous time series data on the labour force in The Gambia will be invaluable for measuring changes over time in the labour market, formulate policy, monitor and evaluate labour market and employment related interventions. The findings of the study will also show the employment status of women, children, youths, the elderly and persons with disabilities.

The Gambia is in the process of conducting the first nationally representative Labour Force Survey. The first Labour Force Survey was conducted in 1992. This was on a small scale both in scope and coverage. The indicators were not many and only the Greater Banjul Area was covered.

Another labour related survey called the Joint Rural Labour Force / Youth Employment / CDDP Baseline Survey was conducted in 2008. It was a nationally representative survey. The main objective of the Rural Labour Force Survey was to provide primary data to inform the current study on the Impact of Macroeconomic and Social Policies on Employment and Poverty Reduction in The Gambia. The findings of the study were to facilitate national planning towards the achievement of the MDGs, through development and implementation of pro-poor economic and sectoral policies and strategies. It was also to provide information on the capacity of the labour force to exploit economic opportunities accruing from growth.

Employment issues were also covered by the previous population and Housing Censuses as well as in modules of Household Surveys over the past years.

The 2012 Labour Force Survey is geared towards providing labour market indicators assist in policy and decision making at the marco and micro level. Indicators produced would also be helpful in monitoring the labour market, stream lining of employment in national development agendas such as the PAGE and Vision 2020 and international targets such as the MDGs.

1.3 Objective

There is scanty labour market information, coupled with the forthcoming establishment of the Labour Market Information system, data The Gambia. The study was commissioned to meet the increasing demand for labour statistics both locally and internationally. Bureau of Statistics (GBoS) has, to improve the timeliness, quality, scope and coverage of statistics that it produces.

Findings from this study would enable policymakers to plan, measure, monitor and evaluate labour market, PAGE and Vision 2020 and international targets such as the MDGs.



1.4 Analytical Framework

The Government of The Gambia is in the process of establishing a Labour Market Information System. The primary aim of this entity is the provision of reliable, relevant and timely information on the labour market to planners, policy makers and other users. The overall objective of the LMIS is to:

- (i) monitor the short-term developments in the labor market, labor market patterns, the impact by events/crisis, level and changes in unemployment rates among nationals and non-nationals, movement of wages, etc;
- (ii) monitor the underlying shifts in the workforce: the skills dynamics in an economy, and how education and training systems can respond;
- (iii) develop targeted and evidence-based policy interventions;
- (iv) assess the impact of policies on specific groups i.e. nationals, expatriate workers, youth, women;
- (v) conduct research on employment related issues;
- (vi) Facilitate access to employment information through employment agencies or employment exchanges;
- (vii) Facilitate career development through career advice centres in schools and other educational institutions;
- (viii) Provide forecast for labour supply and demand requirements

ILO's 20 Key Indicators of the Labour Market (KILM) was identified as the core list of indicators for the proposed LMIS in The Gambia. Decent work indicators and the African Union (AU) minimal list of indicators would be produced. However, it has been realised that it would not be possible to provide all targeted indicators. Below are list of indicators to be computed from this study:

1.5 Conceptual Framework of Work and Labour Force Statistics - 19th ICLS

The International Conference of Labour Statisticians (ICLS) under the auspices of the ILO has convened consultative meetings on the proposed changes to be tabled before the forthcoming 19th ICLS. This resolution basically centres on the new concept of Work and Labour Force.

Work comprises of any activity, paid or unpaid, performed by persons of any sex, to produce goods or services for consumption by others, or for own consumption. According to proposed changes, Work excludes:

- i. activities that cannot be performed on one's behalf by another person, including all self-care and own recreation activities;
- ii. activities in the context of education or training that do not produce goods or services for consumption by others; and
- iii. all other activities that do not produce goods or services for own consumption or for consumption by others, as begging and stealing.

This definition of work conforms with productive activities included inside the General production boundary as defined in the 2008 System of National Accounts (SNA), thereby enabling direct integration with production statistics.

Employment is a form of Work. Other forms of work include: Own production of goods, Unpaid trainee work, Volunteer work, Own production of services. This refinement enhances the accounting for the contribution of women in the national economy.

Employment refers to all activities carried out by persons to produce goods or services mainly to generate income in market or non-market economic units or in households. *Persons in employment* are defined as those above a specified age who worked to generate income in the form of salary, profit or family gain, paid in cash or in kind during the reference period of measurement,

- (a) for at least one hour (i.e. employed persons at work), or
- (b) had a job (i.e. had already worked at their present job or enterprise) but were temporarily absent for specific reasons (i.e. employed persons not at work).

Considered as employed and classified as "at work" or "not at work" on the same basis as other persons in employment are:

- (a) Contributing family workers irrespective of the number of hours worked during the reference period, as they provide inputs of labour in market oriented enterprises generating income for the household.
- (b) Apprentices, interns and trainees who receive pay in cash or in kind, if their training takes place within the context of the enterprise and is associated with its production of goods and services.
- (c) Persons in employment promotion schemes who receive pay in cash or in kind, including a government social benefit. Those in job training schemes not associated with the production of goods and services of the enterprise are classified as employed "at work" if the enterprise employed them before the training period and they had an assurance of return to work.
- (d) Persons on training required by the job or for another job in the same economic unit are classified as employed at work, while persons being compensated for overtime and shift work are classified as employed not at work, in accordance with the international standards on measurement of working time.
- (e) Producers of goods mainly to generate income who also use part of the production for own consumption. Consequently, they are excluded from own production of goods on the basis of that activity.
- (f) Persons mainly engaged in other forms of work (own production of goods, volunteer work, unpaid trainee work, own production of services) and in other activities (studies, self-care, cultural or recreational activities, etc.) during the reference period, who at the same time were in employment as defined in this resolution.

Not considered as employed are persons who in the reference period were:

- (a) on indefinite lay-off, that is with no assurance of return to work with the same employer;
- (b) with seasonal employment jobs during the off-season, if they cease to perform activities related to that income-generating job;
- (c) on extended absence from employment (i.e. absences with a total elapsed duration beyond the limit set for defining temporary absence from employment);
- (d) exclusively engaged in forms of work other than employment.

Despite these refinements, the labour force still basically comprise of the employed and the, unemployed. Whilst the economically active is basically the labour force and the economically inactive consist of persons in the working age population who are not part of the labour force.

1.6 Concepts and Definitions

According to the *International Classification of Status in Employment* (ICSE-93), employed persons are classified according to the following categories: (a) employees; (b) employers; (c) members of producers' cooperatives; (d) own-account workers; (e) contributing family workers (formerly referred to as unpaid family workers); and (e) workers not classifiable by status.15¹

The groups in the ICSE-93 are defined with reference to the distinction between "paid employment" jobs and "self-employment" jobs. *Paid employment jobs* are those jobs where the incumbents hold explicit (written or oral) or implicit employment contracts which give them a basic remuneration not directly dependent upon the revenue of the unit for which they work. *Self-employment jobs* are those jobs where the remuneration is directly dependent upon the profits (or the potential for profits) derived from the goods and services produced (where own consumption is considered to be part of profits). The incumbents make the operational decisions affecting the enterprise, or delegate such decisions while retaining responsibility for the welfare of the enterprise.

Employees are all those workers who hold "paid employment jobs". It is often useful to differentiate between key components of the employee group. Employees with stable contracts are those employees who have had, and continue to have, an explicit (written or oral) or implicit contract of employment, or a succession of such contracts, with the same employer on a continuous basis. Regular employees are those employees with stable contracts for whom the employing organization is responsible for payment of relevant taxes

and social security contributions and/or where the contractual relationship is subject to national labour legislation.

Employers are those workers who, working on their own account or with one or a few partners, hold a 'self-employment job', and, in this capacity, on a continuous basis have engaged one or more persons to work for them in their business as employee(s). The partners may or may not be members of the same family or household.

Own-account workers are those workers who, working on their own account or with one or more partners, hold a 'self-employment job' and have not engaged on a continuous basis any employees to work for them during the reference period. The partners may or may not be members of the same family or household.

Members of producers' cooperatives are workers who hold a 'self-employment' job in a cooperative producing goods and services, in which each member takes part on an equal footing with other members in determining the organization of production, sales and/or other work of the establishment, the investments and the distribution of the proceeds of the establishment amongst their members.

Contributing family workers (CFW) also called unpaid family workers, are those workers who hold a 'self-employment' job in a market-oriented establishment operated by a related person living in the same household, who cannot be regarded as partners, because their degree of commitment to the operation of the establishment, in terms of working time or other key factors, is not at a comparable level to that of the head of the establishment.

1.7 Survey Methodology

1.7.1 Design of Survey Instruments

Survey instruments such as questionnaires, listing forms, Fieldwork Manual, Control forms were developed. The questionnaire design took more time than anticipated due to the need to ensure that variables required for the computation of indicators were in the questionnaire.

Due the need for data quality and international comparability labour force survey related literature was reviewed whilst consultations were made with GAMJOBS, the ILO and sister Statistical Agencies that have conducted Labour Force Surveys recently. Permission was given by the Uganda Bureau of Statistics to adapt their 2011 Labour Force Survey questionnaire and fieldwork manual. We acknowledge the Uganda Bureau of Statistics and ILO staff assistance on questionnaire design and other support.

About a week was spent finalizing the questionnaire and fieldwork manual after the pretest. This required careful work as we had to ascertain that the instrument would be representative enough. Following the finalization of the tools, copies were circulated for comments to local and international partners and collaborators for comments and suggestions.

1.7.2 Study Design

The population of interest, indicators and sample size were determined. A two-stage stratified random sampling design was used to arrive at the required sample size. In the first stage the EAs were selected by probability proportional to size systematic sampling. The second stage 20 households were selected by circular systematic sampling procedure in each EA. For the whole country, including all LGAs, Urban and Rural areas, out of 225 EAs, 4500 households were selected which translated to an estimated 40,026 individuals who were listed, and covered in the survey.

1.7.3 Sample Design

The Labour Force Survey used the 2003 Population and Housing Census list of Enumeration Areas (EAs) as its sampling frame. EA maps prepared by the GIS/Cartography Section of GBOS guided the interviewers in tracing the EA boundaries.

A two-stage stratified random sampling design was implemented. In the first stage EAs were selected by probability proportional to size systematic sampling in each stratum. In the second stage sampling 20 households were selected by circular systematic sampling procedure in each EA. It was estimated that 40,026 individuals would be listed in the 4500 households.

1.7.4 Sample Size Determination

The margin of error tolerated is 12 per cent. This was used in an excel spreadsheet with the coverage rate (r = 23.4 per cent) of a key indicator – proportion of economically active population aged 20-44 years in order to calculate the sample size in terms of households from the following formula:

where

n is the required sample size, expressed as number of households.

4 is factor to achieve 95 percent level of confidence,

r = 23.4 per cent is the anticipated coverage rate for the key indicator,

1.016 is factor to raise sample size by 1.6 percent for potential non response at household.

Deff. is shortened symbol for design effect = 1.951,

0.12r is margin of error to be tolerated, defined as 12 percent of r (12 percent thus represents the relative sampling error of r),

p = 0.048 is the proportion of the base or target population to the total population.

n = 8.3 persons is average household size.

1.7.5 Sample Allocation

The table below shows the sample allocations based on, among other things, the 2003 sampling frame representing all Local Government Areas (LGAs). There are 14 domains when LGAs are stratified into urban and rural areas.

1.7.6 Sampling Weights

The sample design presented above shows that 6 of the 8 LGAs were over sampled. This implies that the design was not self weighting. This could have been caused by sampling and non-sample errors or structural changes in the population. Therefore in presenting the results of the survey there was the need to compensate for sampling errors by applying sampling weights to the results.

Tables or data can be weighted by multiplying the sample data with a normalized sample weight to compensate for the oversampling. Two types of sample weights are used in this report: the normalized sample weight for household (named HHWEIGHT in the household data set) and the normalized sample weight for eligible persons 5 years and over (named ELIGIBLES in the household listing data set).

The normalized sample weight for household is obtained as follows:

1.7.7 Training of Fieldworkers

Following the adaption of the questionnaire, trainee survey field personnel were recruited and trained for three days. Many of the trainees were from the Ministry of Trade, GBoS, and Department of Community Development. Most of the trainees had survey experience. A training program was prepared and training started on the 24th March 2012.

The training was conducted by facilitators from GBOS. Mrs Sally Touray of GAMJOBS gave an overview of employment policy in The Gambia. The training was initially planned for three days, but due to the complexity and bulkiness of the questionnaire, an extra day's training was added enhance understanding of the questionnaire. The training was interrupted for three days due an unanticipated two-day public holiday that span into the following weekend. The training was interactive and participatory and on the whole participants did utmost to understand.

1.7.8 Pre-test

The pre-test was held on the 2nd of April 2012, immediately after the last training session. There wasn't sufficient time for the pre-test; as we had to cover some aspects of the training during the day. This was slated for the pre-test. As such, all the participants were assigned a single household near the training venue to interview. The trainers supervised them and later collected their questionnaires for review. Some managed to complete their households but some could not. However, all enumerators managed to interview some respondents in their assigned households.

Although there should have been more time for pre-test, however, the relatively short time they had for the pre-test enabled us to also assess those that can work under pressure with minimal errors. The pre-test could not be reviewed as planned, but a meeting was convened at GBoS to ostensibly review the questionnaire and pre-test.

The training was period was short and more time should be allocated to the training, pretest and review of pre-test. Sixty-eight participants including trainers, trainees and driver were part of the training

1.7.9 Fieldwork

There were 10 teams comprising of 4 enumerators, one supervisor and one driver per team. In total, *there* will be 40 enumerators, 10 supervisors, 10 Drivers and 2 field coordinators. The Supervisors were responsible for the day to day operations of the team which include identifying EAs and overseeing enumeration as well field editing. The survey coordinator supervised all survey activities including recruitment of survey design, training, fieldwork, data processing, analysis, report writing and dissemination. He made frequent visits to all teams during the fieldwork and he also designed the coding scheme and reviewed the data processing programmes.

The teams were deployed for fieldwork across the country on the 20th April 2012 and most of them started work on the 21st April 2012. The deployment was delayed in part, due the servicing and acquisition of vehicles. The fieldwork was scheduled to last for 30 days. All teams except one could not met the deadline. It was also realised that the work load was heavy and it would ideal to increase the number of teams next time to reduce the work load and also ensure smooth operations.

1.7.10 Data Processing

The data processing for the labour force survey 2012 was carried out mainly in two stages:

The first stage of the data processing dealt with the cleaning and editing of data files. This basically involves the following activities: main data entry, verification, structural checks, editing, etc. Imputations were minimal.

The other phase data of the processing was to produce analysis data files and to create the tables. Secondary data processing involved the following steps: concatenating data files, create SPSS data sets, generation of tables, computation of sampling weights and wealth indices, etc.

Coding and structural inconsistencies were detected during data processing and data analysis and resolved. This task was time consuming.

1.8 Limitations

CHAPTER 2: CHARACTERISTICS OF THE POPULATION

2.1 Household Composition

The Gambia 2012 Labour Force Survey (GLFS) collected information on private households only. The average household size for the country was 6.8 or 7.2 persons per household for weighted and unweighted data respectively. Household size in rural areas (8.7 persons per household unweighted) was comparatively higher than urban areas where household size averaged 5.5 (unweighted). For regional disaggregation, the Janjangbureh and Basse registered highest household sizes 9.3 and 9.1 persons per household (unweighted) respectively. Banjul and Kanifing Local government areas registered the lowest household sizes of 4.8 and 5.6 persons per household (unweighted) respectively. See Table 2.1 below.

2.3 Population by Age and Sex

Despite noticeable differences at the base of the 2003 and LFS-2012 population pyramid, the population structure is still skewed towards younger age cohorts. The apparent change at the base (0-4 years) age cohort could be attributed to, sampling and non-sampling errors, fertility, mortality, migration, population structure and related issues. For instance, a youthful population, with relative improvements in socio-economic and health conditions, could trigger population growth; particularly at the younger ages for a while. (See Table 2.3 and population pyramid in (Figure 2.3.2a and 2.3b below).






Figure 0.1 (Figure 2.3.a): Population by Age and Sex, 2003





2.3.1 Working Age and Youth Population by Sex

There were an estimated 962,900 persons of working age (15-64 years) and this constituted 52.0 percent of the total estimated population of 1,851,178 persons in The Gambia in 2012. Of these, 46.2 percent were male, whilst 53.8 percent were female. This shows that there were relatively more working age females compared to working age males.

The National Youth Policy of The Gambia, youth is defines as persons between the ages of 13-30 years. They amount to an estimated 664,296 persons in 2012 and this constituted 34.1 percent of the population. Of these, 44.7 percent were male, whilst 55.3 percent were female.

The AU defines youth age cohort as (15-35 years). They amount to an estimated 631,596 persons in 2012 and this constituted 35.9 percent of the population. Of these, 44.6 percent were male, whilst about 54.4 percent were female.

Whilst the UN defines as Youth age group as 15-24 year-olds. They amount to an estimated 360808 persons in 2012 and this constituted 19.5 percent of the population. Of these, 45.8 percent were male, whilst about 54.2 percent were female.

On the whole, there are relatively mare female youths compared to their male counterparts using any of the three above youth age cohort definitions. See Figure 2.3.1 below and Tables 2.3.1a and 2,3,1b in Annex2.




Figure 0.3 (Figure 2.3.1): Working Age Population (15-64 years) by Sex, April, LFS-2012

2.4 Sex Ratio

Sex ratio is defined as the number of males per 100 females. The sex ratio analysis is based on unweighted LFS-2012 data of all the survey population. Sex ratio less than 100 indicates that there are relatively more female, whilst a sex ratio greater than 100 indicates that there are relatively more males than females. In The Gambia, however serious variations in sex ratio could largely be attributed to the effects of migration.

The sex ratio for The Gambia as a whole from the LFS-2012 is 95.4 males per 100 females. This shows that there are relative more female than males in the population.

In comparison, LFS-2012 sex ratio is relatively lower than computed sex ratios of 97.2 males per 100 females for 2003 Population and Housing Census.

2.4.1 Sex Ratio by LGA

Banjul and Kanifing LGAs registered the highest sex ratio of 109.9 and 102.0 males per 100 females. This implies that these LGAs have a relatively more males than males. Lower than 100 sex ratio was recorded by other LGAs and this shows that there were relatively more females compared to males. The lowest sex ratio of 86.8 males per 100 females was recorded for Kuntaur LGA.

In comparison, LFS-2012 sex ratio, resembles the 2003 Population and Housing Census sex ratio by LGA. Although there seem to be general decline of sex ratio across LGAs when LFS-2012 and 2003 Census is compared, Kerewan LGA seemed to be an exception, as it registered a relatively higher sex ratio in LFS-2012. This shows an apparent increase in the number of males in Kerewan LGA. This trend could be attributed to increase birth of males compared to females, relatively more in-migrant males, relatively less out-migrant males or relatively lower death rate of males compared to females.

As noted in the above paragraph, the general decline in the proportion of males compared to the apparent in increase in the proportion of females in the country's population could have socio-economic implications – notably impact on the labour force.

Figure 0.4 (Figure 2.4.1): Sex Ratio by LGA for LFS-2012 and 2003 Census, April LFS-2012


2.4.2 Sex Ratio by Age Group

It is apparent that in supposedly the most productive ages particularly in the 15-54 age range there seemed to be relative more females than males in this population segment. In comparison to 2003 population and housing census sex ratio, the composition of this age range in the general population seemed to have increased over the comparative period. This would imply that there might be need for more females to enter the labour force to urgment the traditional labour supply that used to be provided or could be provided by males.

Another observation in LFS-2012 is a likely reverse trend if population age structure at the older ages 55 years and over. There is a likelihood of the composition of this subset of the population being more males than females as compared to 2003 population and housing census in particular.

Some of the factors responsible for this could be an increase in return migrants from abroad; increased in elderly immigrants, lower death rates of elderly males compared to elderly females etc. If this is a trend, another likely cause, could be increased venturing of relatively more females than usual in the labour force. This could expose them to the rigours of certain preoccupations in the labour market which in turn could adversely affect their health as they aged. This could also precipitate relatively increase in mortality of aged females, thus set the scene for the reversal of the past trend of females having relatively higher live expectancy. See figure 2.4.2.

Figure 0.5 (Figure 2.4.2): Sex Ratio by Age group for LFS-2012, MICS4 and 2003 Census, April LFS-2012




2.5 Relationship by Sex

The figure below shows that households are mainly composed of children of household heads (27.0 percent), followed by household heads (24.1 percent), wives or husbands (23.9 percent) and other relatives (13.7 percent).

2.6 Marital Status by Sex



The figure below shows that households are mainly composed of children of household heads (27.0 percent), followed by household heads (24.1 percent), wives or husbands (23.9 percent) and other relatives (13.7 percent).

House heads were predominantly male, and they constituted 81.5 percent whilst females were made up of 18.5 percent. In contrast, for the wife or husband category, 98.9 percent were wives compared to 1.1 percent husbands. For the children of household heads, 56.8 percent and males and 43.2 percent are female. (See figure 2.5).

Majority (60.3 percent) of the working age population (15-64 years) were married; whilst 35.9 percent were never married. The divorced, separated and widowed constituted 1.2 percent, 0.2 percent and 2.3 percent respectively. See figure 2.6 below and Table 2.6a and table 2.6b in Annex 2.

2.7 Education and Training

2.7.1 Introduction

The need for education to improve the human resource base of the country is embedded in our development agenda and articulated in various national policy frameworks.

The country's long-term development agenda Vision 2020 recognised the vitality of education in the realisation of its goal of improving the wellbeing of the population. One of its main objectives is to have a "well-educated, trained, skilled, healthy, self-reliant and enterprising population."

The 2004-2015 Education Policy is also geared to education outcomes that would improve the country's economic development prospects. It basically aims to impart education, livelihood skills, instil creativity and entpreneurship to foster economic self-reliant reliance.

One of the goals of the Employment policy (2010-2014), is to promote a well educated, trained, skilled versatile, self-reliant and enterprising labour force with a view to increasing employment. It further promotes the development of relevant manpower/human resources that will continually meet the needs of the nation.

The national Youth policy (2009-2018), realised the need for a well-trained, highly skilled and youthful workforce to bolster youth participation in national development. Some of the measures to address this include; ensuring completion of secondary education, availability of skills training facilities across the country etc..

The importance of a well educated labour force to the well being of a nation's economy is supported by a wealth of statistical evidence. More recently, in the last two decades, as the demand for, and awareness of the importance of higher education has accelerated, the attention of policy makers has expanded to include a more careful examination of the type and quality of education, and in some jurisdictions, specific policies have been adopted to encourage changes intended to create a better match between education and the changing labour market. Currently, most Developing Countries include general initiatives to increased emphasis on technical, vocational, and specific career training in the college sector, as well as more specific initiatives such the expansion of engineering and computer programs at universities.

A parallel and related development has been the changing structure of the economy: output growth, employment, and productivity gains have shifted away from some of the more traditional manufacturing and resource based industries toward high knowledge, service versus product oriented, and highly technical industries. The phenomenon of structural change in the economy over the past 20 years has been referred to, sometimes very imprecisely, by a variety of often confusing terms: "new (world) economy," "global economy," "information age," "hi-tech economy," "knowledge economy." The overwhelmingly most prominent feature of this structural change, both from the point of

view of the individual participating in the economy, and the statistical evidence, is the demand for higher levels of education and skills. As a result of these basic educational requirements enforced by society and more specifically employers, without a functional education system, an individual would have a difficult time functioning and earning an income. If an individual or community fails to focus on the importance of education, the ability to obtain a well-paying job and the subsequent ability to raise a family or pay deals would met ridged barriers.

In addition to career-based objectives, the importance of education is found in daily interaction as well as in a historical context. Without suitable education, technology would cease to expand at the rapid rates we are a custom to. In addition, the ability to understand your nation's history or your standing in the world would not be possible without proper education.

The development of any country depends largely on the number of skilled workers on which the country relies to draw for the jobs that needs to be done. Labour force population acquires skills through the education system, through formal and informal training (on-the-job training) on areas related to the requirements of the job.

2.7.2 Literacy Rate

The United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) defines literacy as the "ability to identify, understand, interpret, create, communicate and compute, using printed and written materials associated with varying contexts. Literacy involves a continuum of learning in enabling individuals to achieve their goals, to develop their knowledge and potential, and to participate fully in their community and wider society." Adult literacy, in international practice, applies only to the population aged 15 years and over, classified by sex, by five-year age-groups, and by urban/rural zones.

A single question was asked about literacy: whether the person could read and write a simple sentence in any language. Table E.1 shows the literacy rate for males and females and the overall literacy rate is 48.3 percent, but it is much higher for males (58.6 percent) than for females (39.4 percent). For the adult age group '15 and above', the reported levels of literacy are 47.8 percent for males and 29.7 percent for females. In terms of locality, the urban rate (at 69.8 percent) is higher than the rural rate (33.9 percent), with a substantial urban-rural difference in rates even among the sex as shown in Table 2.7.1.

Literacy rate at the Local Government Area levels Banjul recorded the highest, 78.6% followed by Kanifing and Brikama with 72.6 percent and 71.0 percent respectively. Basse LGA registered the lowest literacy rate of 22.3 percent followed by Kerewan with 29.2 percent and then Kuntaur with a rate of 30.1 percent. Table 2.7.1 also indicates that the overall literacy rate for youth population aged 13-30 years was 49.2 percent, with variations by sex. A higher proportion of male youths (56.4 percent) can read and write a simple massage in any language compared to their female youths counterparts (43.3 percent).

2.7.2 Educational Attainment by LGA, Residence and Sex

The ability of labour force population to perform well in their economic activities depends not just on their level of educational attainment, but also on any further training that they may have received in the areas related to the work they have to perform. The working population received both on-the-job training, informal and formal training in the form of vocational or professional training. Several questions were asked about school attendance: whether the person had ever attended school, the highest grade completed; and, if still at school or college, the grade they were currently attending.

Table 2.7.2 shows the educational background of the population aged 5 and over. Of the total population aged 5 years and above about 52.1 percent have No formal education, 22.1 percent have completed pre-primary and/or primary education, and 25.8 percent have completed secondary education or higher levels.

Basse Local Government Area (LGA) has the highest proportion of population aged 5 years and above with 'no formal education' (74.2 percent) while the Banjul has the lowest (33.2 percent). As one would expect, urban areas have the lowest proportion of population with 'no formal education' relative to rural areas (38.1 percent versus 67.4 percent). The

proportion of males and females that has 'no formal education' for those aged 5 years and above stand at 47.7 and 56.1 percent respectively.

2.7.3 Educational Attainment by Broad Age groups and Migration Status

The children population has wide variation in the education levels attained. Whilst about 50.2 percent of children had 'no formal education', about 44.1 and 1.0 percent of children aged 5-12 years have respectively completed primary and secondary education and therefore expected lower labour force participation rate. Of the youth population, persons aged 13-30 years, about 39.2 percent had 'no formal education, about 17.8 percent have completed primary education and about 43.7 percent with post primary education or higher training and so they have better chance of participating in the labour market.

The results in Table 2.7.3 below shows that about 52.6 percent of all working age population, persons aged 15-64 years, had 'no formal education (were illiterate) while about only 13.4 percent of the working population had a minimum qualification of Grade 12/GCE/Form 6 and above. This workforce with low education levels tend to be vulnerable and hence participate in low quality jobs with low earnings. The earnings of such categories of workers in most cases are not able to sustain them and their families and therefore they would be among the working poor.

There are notable variations in the distribution of the migration status by education. About 44.7 percent of the 'internal migrant' had 'no formal education' compared to 70.3 and 52.2 percent of the 'international migrant' and 'non-migrant' respectively. While 16.8 percent of the internal migrant population had education level of Grade 12/GCE/Form 6 and above the corresponding proportion of the international migrant and non-migrant population with the same education levels are respectively 6.5 and 7.1 percent.

2.7.4 Vocational Training

Skills training outside the formal school system can play a useful role in developing the workforce in a country. As in the LFS 2012, household members aged 5 and over were therefore asked whether they had received any vocational or professional training (HB27) on the trade or technical skill. If they said they had, they were then asked what type of trade or technical skill did the person learn (HB28).




Figure 2.7.4: Vocational Training by Sex (5 years and over), (Unweighted), April LFS-2012

Table 2.7.4 shows that 8.0 percent of the population 5 years and over had Vocational Training. This is an estimated 115,133 people out of 1,441,775 population 5 years and over. Only eleven percent of males and 5.2 percent of females were also reported to have had vocational training. (See Figure 2.7.4 and Tables 2.7.4a, 2.7.4b, 2.7.4c, 2.7.4d).

2.7.5 Vocational Training by Skill Learnt

As indicated in Table 2.7.5, the major subjects of vocational and professional training are sewing/tailoring/textiles, masonry, carpentry, Automobile/transport repair, beautician/hair/nails, electrician, construction training, welding, health-care/traditional medicine training, agriculture and animal husbandry, teacher training, driving skills, Crafts/Basket Weaving, other craft, trade & industrial, Catering/Food Service, engineering and et al.

The table 2.7.5 also provides more detail on the percent of males and females who acquired skills in each type of training. Tailoring (21.3 percent) registered the highest proportion of the Skills learnt. Of the Gambians who reportedly learnt skills, majority (19.8 percent) learnt tailoring. For Non-Gambians, majority of them too (35.5) percent learnt tailoring.

It is also apparent that, relatively higher proportions, 35.6 percent of females compared with 13.6 percent of males learnt sewing/tailoring/textiles. For Gambians, It is also observed that the women's share is higher than men in beautician/hair/nails, crafts/basket weaving, catering/food service, laundry/dry cleaning, land management, accounting/book keeping, other crafts/industrial activities, pottery/jar making, crocheting/knitting, soap/omo making, computing, tie & dye, traditional birth attendance and gas installation programmes.

The following trades or technical skills were not attended by females but were attended by only male counterparts phone repair, livestock rearing, pilot, photographing, blacksmithing, well digging, hand pump repairs, shop keeping, video/TV repair and in engineering programmes.



2.7.6 How Trade and Technical Skills were Acquired

Different institutions were used by the working age population to learn a trade and/or to acquire specific technical skills needed by persons to perform in a particular job. For the working age population (15-64 years), 42.4 percent of persons acquired a trade and/or technical skill through 'apprenticeship or on-the-job training', 35.7 percent 'learned from a friend or family member, and 17.7 percent learnt trade or technical skills from 'vocational school/course'. Slightly over three percent acquired the trade or technical skills from 'Non-Government Organization (NGO) or Community Organization'. About one percent obtained their skills from other sources. See Figure 2.7.6 below and Tables 2.7.6a, 2.7.6b and 2.7.6c in Annex 2.

2.8 Nationality

About ninety-one percent of the working age population (15-64 years) were Gambian, whilst about 9 percent were Non-Gambian. Of these Non-Gambians, 99 .0 percent were from other West African countries, 0.6 percent from Other African states, whilst 0.5 percent were Non-Africans. Non-Gambians were main consist of Senegalese (55.5 percent) and 25.4 percent were Guinea Conakry nationals.






Figure 2.8.1: Gambian and Non-Gambians (persons 15-64 years) by Sex, April, LFS-2012

For the Gambians, 46.1 percent were males and 52.7 percent were female. In comparison, Non-Gambians comprise of 47.3 percent males and 52.7 percent females. Of the Senegalese, 40.5 percent were males and 59.5 percent were females. The For Guinean Conakry nationals 51.3 percent were males and 48.7 percent were females. Gender composition of Non-Gambians, is in part influenced by relatively number of Senegalese women who come to marry in The Gambia. (See Figure 2.8.1 and Figure 2.8.2 below and Table 2.8.2a and table 2.8.2b in Annex 2.

2.9 Migration

Migration is operationally defined as a change of residence from one Local Government Area of birth to another. Migration could occur more or less continuously over time over a particular time frame or in an indefinite period of time. Migration measured over an indefinite period of time is referred to as life-time migration.

There are two major categories of migration - Internal and International migration. Internal migration here refers to migration between LGAs within the country, whilst International migration addresses the flow of migrants in and out of the country. Flow of migrants into the country is known as immigration whilst the flow of migrants out of the country is known as emigration.

There are various international conventions on migration espoused by the UN and ILO. Their objectives might be similar but they have a different focus.

The United Nations General Assembly on December 18, 1990, adopted an eight-part, 93-article International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of all Migrant Workers and Members of their Families. The UN launched a global campaign to promote migrant rights in 1998, and on July 1, 2003, the Migrant Convention entered into force.

The UN migrant convention aims to "contribute to the harmonization of the attitudes of States through the acceptance of basic principles concerning the treatment of migrant workers and members of their families" by requiring states to adhere to basic human rights standards in their dealings with authorized and unauthorized migrants, including freedom of religion and freedom from arbitrary arrest or imprisonment. It seeks to reduce illegal migration and trafficking and to ensure equal rights for migrants, including border commuters or frontier workers; seasonal workers; project-tied workers, and self-employed workers. A committee of experts was to monitor adherence to the convention, which obliges countries to establish policies, provide information, and assist migrants and their families.

The ILO is the only United Nations agency with a constitutional mandate to protect migrant workers, and this mandate has been re-affirmed by the 1944 Declaration of Philadelphia and the 1998 ILO Declaration on Fundamental Principles and Rights at Work. It has been dealing with labour migration issues since its inception in 1919. It has pioneered international Conventions to guide migration policy and protection of migrant workers. All major sectors of the ILO - standards, employment, social protection and social dialogue - work on labour migration within its overarching framework of "decent work for all". ILO

adopts a rights-based approach to labour migration and promotes tripartite participation (governments, employers and workers) in migration policy.2

ILO Convention 97 deals with international migration for employment, calls for free and accurate information for migrants. Its major provisions include non-discrimination in wages, benefits and social security, and union activities, (Article 6).

ILO Convention 143 deals with "Migrations in Abusive Conditions and the Promotion of Equality of Opportunity and Treatment of Migrant Workers" and opens with a call for member nations to "seek to determine whether there are illegally employed migrant workers on its territory." (Article 2). Article 6 calls for employer sanctions and penalties on traffickers, but Article 9 calls for "equality of treatment" in wages, social security and other benefits for unauthorized migrants who are employed.

"Migrant workers are an asset to every country where they bring their labour. Let us give them the dignity they deserve as human beings and the respect they deserve as workers" - Juan Somavia, Director General of the ILO.3

The 1990 United Nations (UN) International Convention on the Protection of the Rights of All Migrant Workers and Members of their Families defines an international migrant worker as a person who is to be engaged, is engaged or has been engaged in remunerated activity in a State of which he or she is not a national.

2.9.1 International Migration (Immigration)

A proxy indicator for immigration or migrants from other countries in The Gambia is the nationality of respondents and their life-time migration status. As reported in the previous section, Non-Gambians constituted 8.7 percent of the survey population.

However, Immigrants are defined as persons whose Place of Birth was outside The Gambia. Therefore, persons of other nationalities who were born in The Gambia are considered internal migrants.

There were an estimated 113,810 immigrants for respondents 5 years and over and they constituted 6.1 percent of the country's population. Of these immigrants, 47.0 percent were males, whilst 53.0 percent were female.

For the working age population (15-64 years), there were an estimated 98,866 immigrants and they constituted 10.3 percent of this population. Of these immigrants, 45.7 percent

were males, whilst 54.3 percent were female. See Figure 2.9.1a and 2.9.1b below and Tables 2.9.1aa, 2.9.1bb, 2.9.1ba, 2.9.1bb, 2.9.1ca, 2.9.1cb, 2.9.1cc in Annex2.

2.9.2 Internal Migration

Internal migrant is defined as a life-time migrant who is a person whose area of residence (Local Government Area of enumeration) in this survey differs from his Local Government Area of birth.

There were an estimated 274,909 internal migrants for respondents 5 years and over and they constituted 14.9 percent of the country's population. Of these internal migrants, 47.0 percent were males, whilst 53.0 percent were female.

For the working age population (15-64 years), there were an estimated 222,474 internal migrants and they constituted 23.1 percent of this population. Of these immigrants, 46.9 percent were male, whilst 53.1 percent were female.

See Figure 2.9.1a and 2.9.1b below and Tables 2.9.1aa, 2.9.1ab, 2.9.1ba, 2.9.1bb, 2.9.1ca, 2.9.1cb, 2.9.1cc in Annex2.

Table 2.9.1da and Table 2.9.1db below presents the distribution of the survey population by place of birth (origin) and place of enumeration (destination). It should be noted that the diagonal of the table represents the population who were enumerated in the same LGA they were born. Hence, these are either non- migrants or returned migrants. It will be observed from the table that more than half of the enumerated population in the Kanifing Municipality were actually migrants into the LGA with international migrants constituting 6.1 percent. A possible explanation to this could be the proximity of the municipality to the capital city, Banjul, concentration of industrial and other economic activities as well as the growth of housing estates. The internal migrants in the municipality mainly came from neighbouring Brikama, Kerewan and Banjul LGAs.

2.9.3 Non-Migration

Non-migrants are persons who were enumerated in their place of birth and there were an estimated 1,054,475 non-migrants in the population 5 years and over. They constituted 57.0 percent of this country's population. Of these, 48.3 percent were male, whilst 51.7 percent were female.

For the working age population (15-64 years), there were an estimated 627,808 nonmigrants and they constituted 23.1 percent of this population. Of these, 48.3 percent were male, whilst 51.7 percent were female.

Figure 2.9.1a: Migration Status By Sex (5 years and over), April LFS-2012





Figure 2.9.1b: Migration Status By Sex (15-64 years), April LFS-2012



2.9.4 Youth Migration

2.9.4a Migration Status of Gambia Youth (13-30)

According to The Gambia's National Youth Policy (2009-2018), youth age cohort is defined as persons between the ages of 13 to 30 years. There were an estimated 631596 youths (13-30 years) and they constituted 34.1 percent of the country's population.

There were estimated 121,732 youth (13-30 years) internal migrants, and they constituted 19.3 percent of this population. Of these youth internal migrants, 42.9 percent were male, whilst 57.1 percent were female.

The youth (13-30 years) immigrants were estimated at 51586 persons, and they constituted 8.2 percent of this population. Of these youth immigrants, 37.1 percent were male, whilst 62.9 percent were female.




Figure 2.9.4a: Migration Status of Gambia Youth (13-30 years), By Sex, April LFS-2012

Youth (13-30 years) non-migrants were estimated at 448512, and they constituted 71.0 percent of this population. Of these youth non-migrants, 46.2 percent were male, whilst 53.8 percent were female. See Figure 2.9.4a below and Tables: 2.9.4aa and 2.9.4ab.

2.9.4b Migration Status of AU Youth (15-35 years)

The African Union (AU), youth age cohort is defined as persons between the ages of 15 to 35 years. There were an estimated 664,296 youths (15-35 years) and they constituted 35.9 percent of the country's population.

There were estimated 141,236 AU youth (15-35 years) internal migrants, and they constituted 21.3 percent of this population. Of these youth internal migrants, 44.9 percent were male, whilst 55.1 percent were female.

The AU youth (15-35 years) immigrants were estimated at 63,785 persons, and they constituted 9.6 percent of this population. Of these youth immigrants, 40.4 percent were male, whilst 59.6 percent were female.




Figure 2.9.4b: Migration Status of Gambia Youth (15-35 years), By Sex, April LFS-2012

Youth (15-35 years) non-migrants were estimated at 448,666, and they constituted 67.5 percent of this population. Of these youth non-migrants, 45.3 percent were male, whilst 54.7 percent were female. See Figure 2.9.4b below and Tables: 2.9.4ba and 2.9.4bb.








Figure 2.9.4b: Migration Status of Gambia Youth (15-24 years), By Sex, April LFS-2012






CHAPTER 3: ECONOMIC ACTIVITY OF THE POPULATION

3.1 Activity Status

Activity status is determined by identifying those actively supplying labour; those not actively supplying labour and those who are neither actively supplying of not supplying labour. The activity status is also divided into two broad categories: that is the currently and usually active population.

In this report, the currently active population are defined as, or the labour force, comprises all persons 5 years and over who, during the previous week, were employed or the unemployed. In this study, the usually active are identified using a 12 month reference period.

Using the relax activity status the working population shows that the current economically active and inactive population were 719,165 persons and 243,734 persons respectively. This constitutes 74.7 percent, and 25.3 percent of the economically inactive and inactive population.

The table also reveals that there were relatively more economically active male (56.9 percent) in urban areas compared to their female counterparts. In contrast, there relatively more economically active females. For the inactive, females constituted larger proportion of in both urban (58.4 percent) and rural (63.6 percent) areas. See table 3.1 below.

3.2 Labour Force Framework

In accordance with international guidelines, the framework classified the population into three groups: employed population, unemployed population and population outside the labour force; based on their activities during the one week reference period. It uses a set of priority rules to ensure that these groups are mutually exclusive and exhaustive. The priority rules were that, within the one week reference period:

- Economic activity status of employment takes precedence over all other economic activity statuses; and
- For those who are not in employment, the activity status of unemployment takes precedence over the status of not being economically active.
- Thus, in classifying the population according to the labour force framework, the following steps were applied sequentially:
 - o First, identify persons who were employed amongst all those in the population in the minimum working age.
 - Next, from amongst the rest of the population 5 years and over, identify those who were unemployed.
 - Then the residual group in the population, including those below the minimum working age, constitute those outside the labour force (i.e. not currently active).

For analysis in this report labour force indicators were based on the working age population (15-64 years)

CHAPTER 4: CHARACTERISTICS OF THE EMPLOYED AND UNEMPLOYED

3.3 Defining Employment and Unemployment

According to the priority rules of the labour force frame work, employment has precedence over unemployment, and unemployment has precedence over inactivity. A person is employed when he or she has worked for pay, profit, or family gain for at least one hour during the reference period of seven days preceding the interview.

3.3.1 Definition of Employment

For the report, an employed person is, a person of working age (15-64 years) who, during a week, performed some economic such as, employees who did some work for wage, salary, profit or family gain, in cash or in kind; Employers and own account workers/ self employed persons, contributing family workers or unpaid family workers and paid apprentices and volunteers and persons temporarily absent from work. It should be noted that economic activity related information was collected from all persons five years and over.

3.3.1.1 Employment-to- Population Ratio (EPR)

According to ILO, the EPR is defined as the percentage of employed persons in the workingage population. It is often considered a basic yardstick for understanding the overall demand for labour in an economy as provides information on the ability of an economy to generate employment.

3.3.2 Definition of Unemployment

This is can be defined in two ways; "strict or relax "criteria. The difference between the two definitions depends on the inclusion of seeking work or active job search and available for work criteria. Both definitions are consistent with the principles of the labour force frame work and the usage of one has a high impact on the rate of unemployment; the relax definition always yields higher rates of unemployment than the strict.

According the ILO, the unemployed are persons of working age who during the reference (one week for Gambia) period were simultaneously:

- 1. "without work", i.e. not employed, where employment is as defined above;
- 2. "currently available to work", i.e. were available for employment during the reference period; and
- 3. "seeking work", i.e. had taken specific steps (active job search) in a specified recent period to look for employment.

The above description is also referred to as the *strict* definition of unemployment. The *relax* measure of unemployment, regards all those without jobs, who are available for work and looked or did not look for work. It is inclusive of all unemployed, whether they made attempts to look for work or not.

The definition also includes future starters, who are persons who are not employed and available for work, but were not looking for work because they have already made arrangements to take up a job or start an enterprise at a date subsequent to the reference period.

According to ILO, in situations where the conventional means of seeking work are of limited relevance, where the labour market is largely unorganised or of limited scope, where labour absorption is, at the time, inadequate or where the labour force is largely self-employed, the standard definition of unemployment is relaxed by excluding the seeking work criterion.

This is likely to be the case in rural areas of developing countries where self-employment prevails and no institutions are properly developed to provide information on the availability of jobs. Moreover, most workers in these areas, as well as in agriculture, do not actively seek work at certain periods of the year since they already have a more or less

complete knowledge of the employment opportunities that exist at various times of the year. (ADB, 2012)

The findings of the LFS-2012, shows the proportion of unemployed persons looking for work or business were 7.2 percent and 4.4 percent respectively. Because the relatively very low job search figures and evidence of above mentioned realities in the country unemployment rate refers to the relax definition of unemployment.

3.4 Unemployment Rate (Working Age Population 15-64 years)

Unemployment rate measures the proportion of the unemployed persons (15-64 years) in the labour force. Using the relax definition, the current rate of unemployment for The Gambia is 29.9 percent. Using this as a yardstick for the official unemployment rate, this shows that about one-in-three persons in the country were unemployed.

However, when the strict definition is applied, the current unemployment rate 11.0 percent. Unemployment rate is higher is relatively higher in rural areas (31.2 percent) compared to urban areas (28.6 percent), using the relax measure. In contrast, Unemployment rate is higher is relatively higher in urban areas (12.2 percent) compared to rural areas (9.7 percent), using the strict measure. The difference in unemployment rate using either the relax or strict measure in urban and rural areas, could be attributed to relatively more job searches in urban areas compared to rural areas.

The overall female unemployment rate (38.4 percent) is comparatively much higher than the male unemployment rate (21.0 percent) using both the relax measure. The tendency is similar when the strict measure is applied. See table 3.4 a, 3.4b, 3.4c.

3.5 Youth Unemployment Rate (Gambia 13-30yrs), AU (15-35 yrs and UN (15-24 yrs)

As stated earlier, there are various definition of youth. Youth age cohort in The Gambia is (13-30) age group. However, for this analysis, the (15-30) age group was used as working age youth in The Gambia. The AU youth is (15-35) age group, whilst the UN youth age group is the (15-24 year-olds).

3.5.1 Youth Unemployment Rate (Gambia Youth 15-30 years of Working Age)

The Gambia's overall Youth unemployment rate was; Both sex (38.6 percent), Males (29.8 percent) and females (45.7 percent). This again shows that relatively more females youth were unemployed compared to male youth. See table 3.5.1a, 3.5.1b, 3.5.1c.
